INDIAN ENGLISH

0.1% Indians have English as their first language;

12.6% Indians know English (5% men speak fluently, 3% women do);

Enrollment in English-medium schools increased by 50% between 2008 and 2014;

Since 1835 English has been used as a medium of instruction;

The Supreme Court of India has chosen English as the only court language;

English is the only reliable means of day to day communication between the central government and the non-Hindu states;

English as an official language - how is that possible?;

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English in India's perspective has been moved from the stain of colonialism to a symbol of economic progress.
